We had made the decision last year to have our "Christmas" lunch in the New Year, well we do like to be different! The appointed Friday in January, the 2nd one to be precise, arrived and it was agreed to meet at high noon instead of the usual 10 o'clock. I was treated to a lift from home service by Keith, how spoilt am I?

The meal was scheduled for 2pm so we visited Meare Church first. The influence of Glastonbury Abbey can be seen in the high ceilings but otherwise it is comparatively plain. It was built in 1324 and improved in 1490.





The ironwork on the door and the 14th century style roof on the chancel were stunning.

There is a very old, very large and beautiful tree in the grounds

Then we took the short walk down the road to the Abbot's Fish House which unfortunately was locked (key available for collection) but we peered in through the unglazed (but barred) windows. It is the only surviving monastic fishery building in England. Its design indicates that it was not for processing fish, although it had

preparation and salting facilities at some point, but a house for the person in charge of the fishery. It was gutted by fire in the 1880s.

The need for culture and exercise satisfied we turned our attention to lunch and drove the short distance to Sweet's, where parking was trickier than expected. As we were early Keith went in to announce our presence. They were ready for us and we were invited in to a section set up for us. The tables were laid with colourful cloths, decorations and New Year crackers. Yes, I know they were indistinguishable from Christmas ones but use your imagination! A drink was poured, followed by plates overflowing with Christmas fare. Various deserts were served but some could not find room, pity as it was delicious. It is a long time since I had eaten so much and indeed did not eat again for 24 hours. Thank you to Keith for organising, Sweet's staff for cooking and serving. Thank you also to the drivers allowing others to have a drink and last but by no means least to Audrey for the photographs.

Somerset Churches 31

Meare

The church of the Blessed Virgin Mary and All Saints dates from 1323 and was originally in the keeping of the Abbey in Glastonbury. The building was consecrated by John Draxford, Bishop of Bath and Wells. The farm next to the church was once a residence of the Abbots of Glastonbury and the village came under their jurisdiction; it is believed that the current church sits on the site of the hermitage of a local saint of the Anglo Saxon era. Only the chancel and the tower remain of this 14th century church. About a century later the then Abbot, John de Selwood had the nave demolished and rebuilt in the fashionable Perpendicular Style.

The Reformation in the 16th century brought huge changes to the church, and the closure of Glastonbury Abbey, with the hanging of Abbot Whiting on Glastonbury Tor, must have had particular significance for the villagers. The monarch was now the head of the Church of England and money had to be found to display the Royal Arms. Important parish documents including the registers of baptisms, marriages and burials, compulsory since the days of Henry VIII, had to be kept in the church. For 700 years the church had served at the heart of the village, and for 700 years the people of Meare and Westhay have been diligent stewards of this inheritance.

Walton

The earliest reference to a church at Walton dates to 1168, when one was recorded as being in the possession of Glastonbury Abbey. Walton formed a benefice with Street from at least the middle of the 13th century with Walton being considered an annexed chapelry. The church was dedicated to St. Nicholas in 1546 and later rededicated to Holy Trinity in the early 18th century in its final form the church was

made up of a nave, chancel, parch and tower with 5 bells. The original central tower and part of the nave were demolished in 1836 and a new tower built on the north side of the church. By the middle of the 19th century the church was in a dilapidated condition. The rector Rev. James George Hickey, embarked on a rebuilding scheme with much of the work being funded by Rev. Hickley and the Marquess of Bath, John Thyne. The consecration took place on the 3rd of May 1866 and Walton became its own parish in 1886 but was later reunited with Street in 1978. Today the church forms part of the benefice of Street, Walton and Compton Dundon.

<u>Ashcott</u>

Christianity came to this part of England at a very early date, and there was a Monastery at Glastonbury in the 7th century or before. It became a house of the Benedictine order, and in course of time under the great St. Dunstan, it attained the status of an abbey and acquired vast estates; Ashcott was part of one of these. The Anglican Church of All Saints in Ashcott was built in the 15th century on the site of an earlier church. The building of it was probably carried out between 1456 and 1492 and bears the arms of John Selwood the Abbot of Glastonbury at the time.

Less than 50 years after that, the church's long association with the Abbey was to end. Henry VIII dissolved the lesser monasteries in 1536 and in 1539 it was the turn of the greater. Three Royal commissioners arrived in Glastonbury, on the 19th September. Abbot Whitting was tried and executed on 15th November on Glastonbury Tor. The Abbey was ransacked, its lands came into the possession of the king, who apparently granted Ashcott to Thomas Walton.


